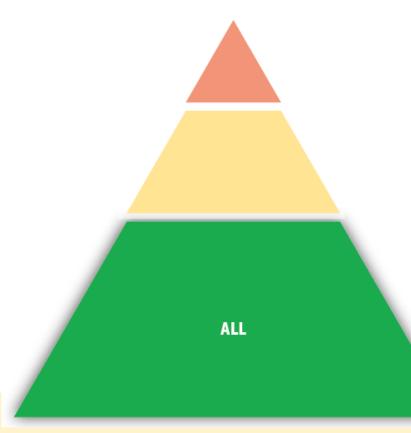

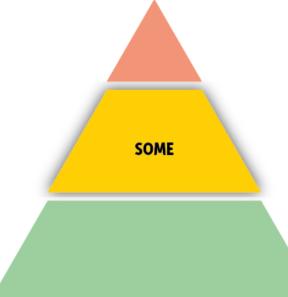

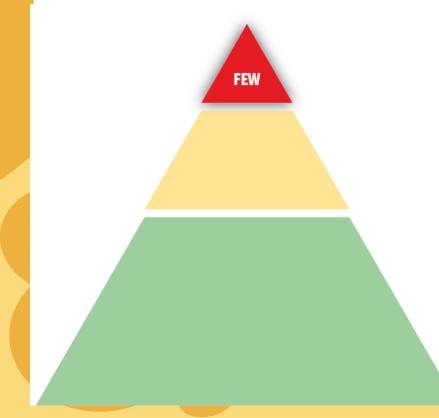

Bond Refinancing 2021: The district is considering the refinancing of approximately \$29 million of SAVE bonds, which is estimated to save the district approximately \$1.5 to \$2.2 million of interest costs over the remaining term of the bonds. The preliminary schedule for the refinancing transaction has the setting of a public hearing date for June 14th, the sale of bonds for July 12th, and the transaction closing date in mid-August.

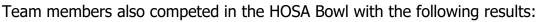

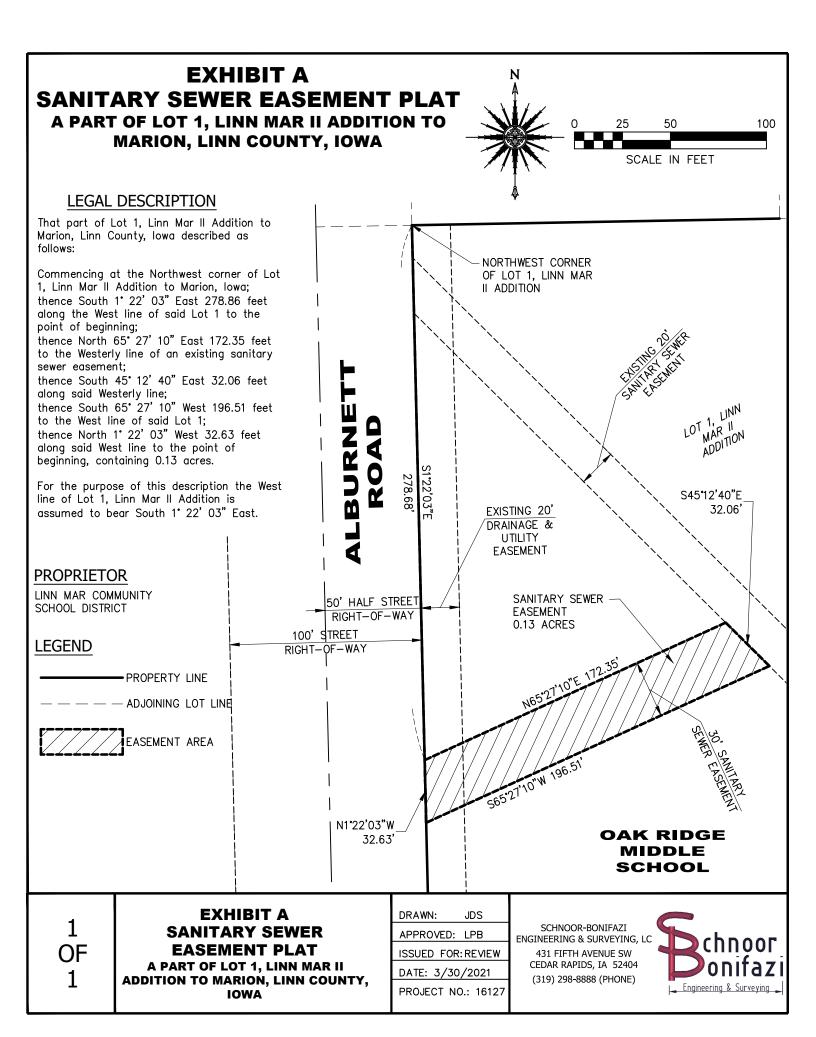
